Set-Up Your Space

Some Ideas to Get You Started

Tell us a unique story along your career pathway.

Are you the first in your family to work in a STEM career? Were you insecure about your math skills growing up, but use them daily and joyfully today? Do you find yourself working in tech, despite having no clear pathway there?

Speak directly into the camera, like you are talking to youth, and communicate your experiences.

Chat with a colleague or friend on camera.

Have a conversation with another about your STEM experiences. Compare career pathways. Share more about your early interest in STEM.



Demonstrate your skills.

Film yourself putting together a phone. Demonstrate an engineering concept. Test your hypothesis with us.
